OUT!
(NOT COVERED)

An ASA umpire parks his new car along the left field line during a game so he can admire and watch it and his windshield is broken by a foul ball. Safe or Out?



OUT!
(Not Covered)

An ASA umpire, anticipating a play at the plate, throws a bat that was in the way and injures a player in the on-deck circle. The player sues the umpire for his negligence. Safe or Out?



SAFE!
(Covered)

An ASA umpire traveling from his home to umpire a game is injured in an automobile accident and after no fault insurance and his own health insurance has been used up he has a balance of **\$1,000** in medical bills. Safe or Out?



SAFE!
(Covered)

An ASA umpire, after umpiring an ASA game, stops at a local pub for a few beers. On his way home from the pub he is injured in an automobile accident and after no fault insurance and his own health insurance has been used up has a balance of \$1,000 in medical bills. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpire sustains a minor injury during an ASA softball game resulting in \$500 in medical bills but his own health insurance has a \$500 deductible. Safe or Out?



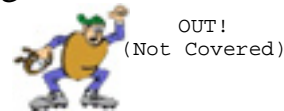
An ASA umpire is injured in a college game between two teams that are NOT ASA registered but their schools are a member of the NCAA, an affiliated member of ASA. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpire is told repeatedly during the game that a stake is protruding underneath 2nd base but allows play to continue with this dangerous condition. Late in the game someone is severely injured by sliding into the base and sues the umpire for his negligence. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpire who has his own health coverage through a managed care provider injurs his knee and decides to go out of network to a sports injury specialist. His health care provider denies coverage. He submits the claim under his ASA umpire insurance. Safe or Out?



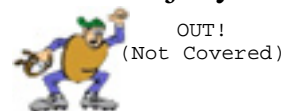

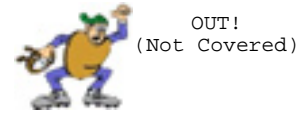
Two ASA teams are ready to play a game, but the ASA umpire has not shown up. A parent volunteers to umpire and is injured. Safe or Out?



Two ASA registered teams are playing each other in another softball association's tournament using ASA umpires. As a result of an injury to a player one of the ASA umpires is sued. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpires association informs an umpire that they will no longer assign him due to a number of infractions, etc. The umpire sues the association for their “wrongful act”. Safe or Out?



A state or metro Umpire-In-Chief is sued for a similar “wrongful act”. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpire sustains a serious head injury while umpiring an ASA game, which requires 3 months of hospitalization. The total medical bills are \$99,999. And he has no other coverage. Safe or Out?



An ASA umpire allows a game to continue during thunder and lightning. A lightning bolt strikes the metal bench of the team at bat electrocuting or maiming everyone on the team and is sued for his negligence. A jury awards damages totaling \$4,999,999 million against the umpire and ASA. Safe or Out?
